

About



BUSTLING WITH LIFE, YET SURROUNDED BY HISTORY.

The NSW State Heritage listed town of Braidwood offers the ultimate country getaway, complete with stories of bushrangers, gold seekers and more, as well as beautiful sun-dappled walks, handcrafted treasures and unforgettable stays, all set against the beautiful backdrop of the Southern Tablelands.

Originally, the Braidwood area was occupied by the Yuin Nation for tens of thousands of years. European explorers first arrived in 1822, settling throughout the 1820s near the headwaters of the Shoalhaven River. In the early 1800s, the town grew little by little until the gold rushes of the 1850s. During this era, Braidwood was booming as the primary town in the district. However, as the gold ran out, so did migration.

A bustling business centre developed near Monkittee Creek in the 1940s, housing notable buildings such as the Old Post Office, Braidwood Museum, Braidwood Hotel and the Court House to this day. Over time, this business centre started moving south with hotels, such as the Albion and the Criterion, built in the latter half of the 19th century in response to the town's growing needs during the gold rush era.

Getting here


NESTLED BETWEEN CANBERRA AND THE UNSPOILED SOUTHERN NSW COASTLINE.


The region also serves as the ideal base for exploring the wonders of Canberra, the NSW South Coast, the Snowy Mountains and Sydney.

UNCOVER THE LOCAL TALES AND HANDMADE WARES.

From its rich Indigenous history as the ancestral lands of the Yuin Nation to its colonial roots dating back to the first European settlement of the region, Braidwood is a treasure trove of stories waiting to be discovered. Explore a bygone era as you walk along the streets of Braidwood on a self-guided heritage tour or pay a visit to the Braidwood Museum boasting an impressive collection of preserved artefacts and photos.

Walk along Braidwood's main street and you may even recognise some of the rustic and rural streetscapes from iconic Australian films, such as Ned Kelly starring Mick Jagger and The Year My Voice Broke with Ben Mendelsohn.

Well known for its creative community, Braidwood boasts a range of art galleries, showrooms, jewellers and more. Find new pieces of art for your home, browse antiques, vintage treasures and collectables, and upgrade your jewellery collection with handmade pieces from Braidwood's talented makers.



Braidwood Museum

Make the most of the region's seasonal offerings and head out to the local truffle farms in the cooler months to experience the crisp winter mornings spent on truffle hunts. The region is also home to unspoiled national parks, giving you plenty of options for outdoor adventures whether you're looking for an easy stroll through vast bushland, thrilling mountain biking tracks or camping under the stars.
